You have laid the beams of your chambers on the waters. You make the clouds your chariot, You ride on the wings of the wind. You make the winds your messengers, fire and flame your ministers. You set the earth on its foundations, so that it should never be shaken. You cover it with the deep as with a garment; the waters stood above the mountains. At Your rebuke they fled; at the sound of Your thunder they took to flight. The mountains rose, the valleys sank down to the place that You appointed for them. You set a bound which they should not pass, so that they might not again cover the earth.

The young lions roar for their prey, seeking their food from God. When the sun rises, they withdraw and lie down in their dens. Man goes forth to his work and to his labor until the evening. Lord, how manifold are your works! In wisdom You have made them all; the earth is full of Your creatures. Yonder is the sea, great and wide, which teems with things innumerable, living things both small and great. There go the ships, and Leviathan that You have formed to sport in it. These all look to You to give them their food in due season; when You give to them, they gather it up; when You open your hand, they are filled with good things. When You hide your face, they are dismayed; when You take away their breath, they

die and return to their dust. When You send forth Your Spirit, they are created; and You renew the face of the earth.

May the glory of the Lord endure forever; may the Lord rejoice in His works, Who looks on the earth and it trembles, Who touches the mountains and they smoke. ### First Reading

**DEACON:** Wisdom!

#1 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from Genesis

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Gen 1:1-13) In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. 4 And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, "Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said, "Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

#### #2 -

**READER:** The Reading is from the Prophecy of Isaiah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

READER: (Isaiah 60:1-16) Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the Lord will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the Lord. All the flocks of Kedar shall be gathered to you, the rams of Nebaioth shall minister to you; they shall be acceptable on my altar, and I will glorify my glorious house. Who are these that fly like a cloud, and like doves to their windows?

For the coastlands shall wait for me, the ships of Tarshish first, to bring your children from far away, their silver and gold with them, for the name of the Lord your God, and for the Holy One of Israel, because he has glorified you. Foreigners shall build up your walls, and their kings

shall minister to you; for in my wrath I struck you down, but in my favor I have had mercy on you. Your gates shall always be open; day and night they shall not be shut, so that nations shall bring you their wealth, with their kings led in procession. For the nation and kingdom that will not serve you shall perish; those nations shall be utterly laid waste. The glory of Lebanon shall come to you, the cypress, the plane, and the pine, to beautify the place of my sanctuary; and I will glorify where my feet rest. The descendants of those who oppressed you shall come bending low to you, and all who despised you shall bow down at your feet; they shall call you the City of the Lord, the Zion of the Holy One of Israel.

Whereas you have been forsaken and hated, with no one passing through, I will make you majestic forever, a joy from age to age. You shall suck the milk of nations, you shall suck the breasts of kings; and you shall know that I, the Lord, am your Savior and your Redeemer, the Mighty One of Jacob.

#### #3 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from Exodus

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Exodus 12:1-11) The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord.

#### #4 \_

**READER:** The Reading is from Jonah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Jonah 1:1-4:11) Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah son of Amittai, saying, "Go at once to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it; for their wickedness has come up before me." But Jonah set out to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid his fare and went on board, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the Lord.

But the Lord hurled a great wind upon the sea, and such a mighty storm came upon the sea that the ship threatened to break up. Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried to his god. They threw the cargo that was in the ship into the sea, to lighten it for them. Jonah, meanwhile, had gone down into the hold of the ship and had lain down, and was fast asleep. The captain came

and said to him, "What are you doing sound asleep? Get up, call on your god! Perhaps the god will spare us a thought so that we do not perish." The sailors said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, so that we may know on whose account this calamity has come upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. Then they said to him, "Tell us why this calamity has come upon us. What is your occupation? Where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?" "I am a Hebrew," he replied. "I worship the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land." Then the men were even more afraid, and said to him, "What is that you have done!" For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the Lord, because he had told them so.

Then they said to him, "What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?" For the sea was growing more and more tempestuous. He said to them, "Pick me up and throw me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you; for I know it is because of me that this great storm has come upon you." Nevertheless the men rowed hard to bring the ship back to land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more stormy against them. Then they cried out to the Lord, "Please, O Lord, we pray, do not let us perish on account of this man's life. Do not make us guilty of innocent blood; for you, O Lord, have done as it pleased you." So they picked Jonah up and threw him into the sea; and the sea ceased from its raging. Then the men feared the Lord even more, and they offered a sacrifice to the Lord and made vows. But the Lord provided a large fish to swallow up Jonah; and Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Then Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish, saying, "I called to the Lord out of my distress, and he answered me; out of the belly of Sheol I cried, and you heard my voice. You cast me into the deep, into the heart of the seas, and the flood surrounded me; all your waves and your billows passed over me. Then I said, "I am driven away from your sight; how shall I look again upon your holy temple?" The waters closed in over me; the deep surrounded me; weeds were wrapped around my head at the roots of the mountains. I went down to the land whose bars closed upon me forever; yet you brought up my life from the Pit, O Lord my God. As my life was ebbing away, I remembered the Lord; and my prayer came to you, into your holy temple. Those who worship vain idols forsake their true loyalty. But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you; what I have vowed I will pay. Deliverance belongs to the Lord!"

Then the Lord spoke to the fish, and it spewed Jonah out upon the dry land.

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!"

And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. Then he had a proclamation made in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. Who knows? God may relent and change his

mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish." When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

But this was very displeasing to Jonah, and he became angry. He prayed to the Lord and said, "O Lord! Is not this what I said while I was still in my own country? That is why I fled to Tarshish at the beginning; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and ready to relent from punishing. And now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live." And the Lord said, "Is it right for you to be angry?"

Then Jonah went out of the city and sat down east of the city, and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, waiting to see what would become of the city. The Lord God appointed a bush, and made it come up over Jonah, to give shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort; so Jonah was very happy about the bush. But when dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that attacked the bush, so that it withered. When the sun rose, God prepared a sultry east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint and asked that he might die. He said, "It is better for me to die than to live." But God said to Jonah, "Is it right for you to be angry about the bush?" And he said, "Yes, angry enough to die." Then the Lord said, "You are concerned about the bush, for which you did not labor and which you did not grow; it came into being in a night and perished in a night. And should I not be concerned about Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than a hundred and twenty thousand persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also many animals?"

#### #5 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from Joshua

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Joshua 5:10-15) While the Israelites were camped in Gilgal they kept the Passover in the evening on the fourteenth day of the month in the plains of Jericho. On the day after the Passover, on that very day, they ate the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain. The manna ceased on the day they ate the produce of the land, and the Israelites no longer had manna; they ate the crops of the land of Canaan that year.

Once when Joshua was by Jericho, he looked up and saw a man standing before him with a drawn sword in his hand. Joshua went to him and said to him, "Are you one of us, or one of our adversaries?" He replied, "Neither; but as commander of the army of the Lord I have now come." And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and worshipped, and he said to him, "What do you command your servant, my lord?" The commander of the army of the Lord said to Joshua, "Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy." And Joshua did so.

#6 -

**READER:** The Reading is from Exodus

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Exodus 13:20-15:19) They set out from Succoth, and camped at Etham, on the edge of the wilderness. The Lord went in front of them in a pillar of cloud by day, to lead them along the way, and in a pillar of fire by night, to give them light, so that they might travel by day

and by night. Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people.

Then the Lord said to Moses: Tell the Israelites to turn back and camp in front of Pi-hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea, in front of Baal-zephon; you shall camp opposite it, by the sea. Pharaoh will say of the Israelites, "They are wandering aimlessly in the land; the wilderness has closed in on them." I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and he will pursue them, so that I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army; and the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord. And they did so. When the king of Egypt was told that the people had fled, the minds of Pharaoh and his officials were changed toward the people, and they said, "What have we done, letting Israel leave our service?" So he had his chariot made ready, and took his army with him; he took six hundred picked chariots and all the other chariots of Egypt with officers over all of them. The Lord hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt and he pursued the Israelites, who were going out boldly. The Egyptians pursued them, all Pharaoh's horses and chariots, his chariot drivers and his army; they overtook them camped by the sea, by Pi-hahiroth, in front of Baal-zephon.

As Pharaoh drew near, the Israelites looked back, and there were the Egyptians advancing on them. In great fear the Israelites cried out to the Lord. They said to Moses, "Was it because there were no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us, bringing us out of Egypt? Is this not the very thing we told you in Egypt, 'Let us alone and let us serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." But Moses said to the people, "Do not be afraid, stand firm, and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you see today you shall never see again. The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to keep still."

Then the Lord said to Moses, "Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff, and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them; and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. And the Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers." The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them; and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night.


Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The Lord drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night, and turned the sea into dry land; and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued, and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. At the morning watch the Lord in the pillar of fire and cloud looked down upon the Egyptian army, and threw the Egyptian army into panic. He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, "Let us flee from the Israelites, for the Lord is fighting for them against Egypt." Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea, so that the water may come back upon the Egyptians, upon their chariots and chariot drivers." So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at dawn the sea returned to its normal depth. As the Egyptians fled before it, the Lord tossed the Egyptians into the sea. The waters returned and covered the chariots and the chariot drivers, the entire army of Pharaoh

that had followed them into the sea; not one of them remained. But the Israelites walked on dry ground through the sea, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. Thus the Lord saved Israel that day from the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. Israel saw the great work that the Lord did against the Egyptians. So the people feared the Lord and believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses.

Then Moses and the children of Israel sang this song to the Lord, and spoke saying:

READER: The horse and his rider He has thrown into the sea. Let us sing to the Lord!

He is my helper and protector, and my Savior. Let us sing to the Lord!

This is my God and I will glorify Him; the God of my father and I will exalt Him. Let us sing to the Lord!

The Lord brings wars to an end, the Lord is His name. Pharaoh's chariots and his host He cast into the sea. Let us sing to the Lord!

And his chosen officers are sunk in the Red Sea. Let us sing to the Lord!

The floods cover them, they went down into the depths like a stone. Let us sing to the Lord!

Your right hand, O Lord, has been glorified in power. Let us sing to the Lord!

Your right hand, O Lord, has shattered the enemy, and in the greatness of Your majesty You have overthrown Your adversaries. Let us sing to the Lord!

You send forth Your fury, it consumes them like stubble, and by the spirit of Your displeasure the waters were divided. Let us sing to the Lord!

The waters stood like a wall, the depths congealed in the heart of the sea. Let us sing to the Lord!

The enemy said, "I will pursue and I will overtake, I will divide the spoil, I will satisfy my soul, I will destroy with my sword, my hand shall have dominion. Let us sing to the Lord!

You sent Your Spirit and the sea covered them. They sank as lead in the mighty waters. Let us sing to the Lord!

Who is like You, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like You – glorified in holiness, marvelous in glory, doing wonders. Let us sing to the Lord!

You stretched out Your right hand and the earth swallowed them. In Your righteousness You have led the people whom You have redeemed. Let us sing to the Lord!

Now are the chiefs of Edom dismayed, the leaders of Moab, trembling seizes them. All the inhabitants of Canaan have melted away. Let us sing to the Lord!

Let trembling and fear fall upon them, because of the greatness of Your arm, let them become as stone. Let us sing to the Lord!

Until Your people pass by, O Lord, until the people pass by whom You have purchased. Let us sing to the Lord!

You will bring them in and plant them on Your mountain, the place which You have made for Your abode. The sanctuary, O Lord, which Your hands have made ready. Let us sing to the Lord!

The Lord shall reign forever and ever. For when the horse of the Pharaoh with the chariots and horsemen went into the sea, the Lord brought back the water of the sea upon them. Let us sing to the Lord!

But the children of Israel walked on dry ground in the midst of the sea. Let us sing to the Lord!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Let us sing to the Lord!

Now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. Let us sing to the Lord!

For gloriously has He been glorified!

**READER:** The Reading is from Zephaniah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Zeph 3:8-15) Therefore wait for me, says the Lord, for the day when I arise as a witness. For my decision is to gather nations, to assemble kingdoms, to pour out upon them my indignation, all the heat of my anger; for in the fire of my passion all the earth shall be consumed. At that time I will change the speech of the peoples to a pure speech, that all of them may call on the name of the Lord and serve him with one accord. From beyond the rivers of Ethiopia my suppliants, my scattered ones, shall bring my offering. On that day you shall not be put to shame because of all the deeds by which you have rebelled against me; for then I will remove from your midst your proudly exultant ones, and you shall no longer be haughty in my holy mountain. For I will leave in the midst of you a people humble and lowly. They shall seek refuge in the name of the Lord—the remnant of Israel; they shall do no wrong and utter no lies, nor shall a deceitful tongue be found in their mouths. Then they will pasture and lie down, and no one shall make them afraid.

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall fear disaster no more.

#### #8 –

**READER:** The Reading is from the First Book of Kings

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

READER: (1Kings 17:8-24) Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you." So he set out and went to Zarephath. When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink." As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand." But she said, "As the Lord your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die." Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. For thus says the Lord the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth." She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.

After this the son of the woman, the mistress of the house, became ill; his illness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. She then said to Elijah, "What have you against me, O man of God? You have come to me to bring my sin to remembrance, and to cause the death of my son!" But he said to her, "Give me your son." He took him from her bosom, carried him up into the upper chamber where he was lodging, and laid him on his own bed. He cried out to the Lord, "O Lord my God, have you brought calamity even upon the widow with whom I am staying, by killing her son?" Then he stretched himself upon the child three times, and cried out to the Lord, "O Lord my God, let this child's life come into him again." The Lord listened to the voice of

Elijah; the life of the child came into him again, and he revived. Elijah took the child, brought him down from the upper chamber into the house, and gave him to his mother; then Elijah said, "See, your son is alive." So the woman said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God, and that the word of the Lord in your mouth is truth."

#### #9 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from the Prophecy of Isaiah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Isaiah 61:10-62:5) I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn, and her salvation like a burning torch. The nations shall see your vindication, and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate; but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

#### #10 -

**READER:** The Reading is from Genesis

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Gen 22:1-18) After these things God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." He said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you."

So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you." Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He said, "The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?" Abraham said, "God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt offering, my son." So the two of them walked on together. When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven, and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." He said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. So Abraham called that place "The Lord will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the Lord it shall be provided."

The angel of the Lord called to Abraham a second time from heaven, and said, "By myself I have sworn, says the Lord: Because you have done this, and have not withheld your son, your only son, I will indeed bless you, and I will make your offspring as numerous as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of their enemies, and by your offspring shall all the nations of the earth gain blessing for themselves, because you have obeyed my voice."

#### #11 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from the Prophecy of Isaiah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Isaiah 61:1-9) The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion— to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory.

They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. Strangers shall stand and feed your flocks, foreigners shall till your land and dress your vines; but you shall be called priests of the Lord, you shall be named ministers of our God; you shall enjoy the wealth of the nations, and in their riches you shall glory. Because their shame was double, and dishonor was proclaimed as their lot, therefore they shall possess a double portion; everlasting joy shall be theirs. For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed.

#### #12 -

**READER:** The Reading is from the Second Book of Kings

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (2Kings 4:8-37) One day Elisha was passing through Shunem, where a wealthy woman lived, who urged him to have a meal. So whenever he passed that way, he would stop there for a meal. She said to her husband, "Look, I am sure that this man who regularly passes our way is a holy man of God. Let us make a small roof chamber with walls, and put there for him a bed, a table, a chair, and a lamp, so that he can stay there whenever he comes to us." One day when he came there, he went up to the chamber and lay down there. He said to his servant Gehazi, "Call the Shunammite woman." When he had called her, she stood before him. He said

to him, "Say to her, Since you have taken all this trouble for us, what may be done for you? Would you have a word spoken on your behalf to the king or to the commander of the army?" She answered, "I live among my own people." He said, "What then may be done for her?" Gehazi answered, "Well, she has no son, and her husband is old." He said, "Call her." When he had called her, she stood at the door. He said, "At this season, in due time, you shall embrace a son." She replied, "No, my lord, O man of God; do not deceive your servant." The woman conceived and bore a son at that season, in due time, as Elisha had declared to her.

When the child was older, he went out one day to his father among the reapers. He complained to his father, "Oh, my head, my head!" The father said to his servant, "Carry him to his mother." He carried him and brought him to his mother; the child sat on her lap until noon, and he died. She went up and laid him on the bed of the man of God, closed the door on him, and left. Then she called to her husband, and said, "Send me one of the servants and one of the donkeys, so that I may quickly go to the man of God and come back again." He said, "Why go to him today? It is neither new moon nor Sabbath." She said, "It will be all right." Then she saddled the donkey and said to her servant, "Urge the animal on; do not hold back for me unless I tell you." So she set out, and came to the man of God at Mount Carmel.

When the man of God saw her coming, he said to Gehazi his servant, "Look, there is the Shunammite woman; run at once to meet her, and say to her, Are you all right? Is your husband all right? Is the child all right?" She answered, "It is all right." When she came to the man of God at the mountain, she caught hold of his feet. Gehazi approached to push her away. But the man of God said, "Let her alone, for she is in bitter distress; the Lord has hidden it from me and has not told me." Then she said, "Did I ask my lord for a son? Did I not say, Do not mislead me?" He said to Gehazi, "Gird up your loins, and take my staff in your hand, and go. If you meet anyone, give no greeting, and if anyone greets you, do not answer; and lay my staff on the face of the child." Then the mother of the child said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave without you." So he rose up and followed her. Gehazi went on ahead and laid the staff on the face of the child, but there was no sound or sign of life. He came back to meet him and told him, "The child has not awakened." When Elisha came into the house, he saw the child lying dead on his bed. So he went in and closed the door on the two of them, and prayed to the Lord. Then he got up on the bed and lay upon the child, putting his mouth upon his mouth, his eyes upon his eyes, and his hands upon his hands; and while he lay bent over him, the flesh of the child became warm. He got down, walked once to and fro in the room, then got up again and bent over him; the child sneezed seven times, and the child opened his eyes. Elisha summoned Gehazi and said, "Call the Shunammite woman." So he called her. When she came to him, he said, "Take your son." She came and fell at his feet, bowing to the ground; then she took her son and left.

#### #13 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from the Prophecy of Isaiah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Isaiah 63:11-64:5) Then they remembered the days of old, of Moses his servant. Where is the one who brought them up out of the sea with the shepherds of his flock? Where is the one who put within them his holy spirit, who caused his glorious arm to march at the right hand of Moses, who divided the waters before them to make for himself an everlasting name, who led them through the depths? Like a horse in the desert, they did not stumble. Like cattle

that go down into the valley, the spirit of the Lord gave them rest. Thus you led your people, to make for yourself a glorious name.

Look down from heaven and see, from your holy and glorious habitation. Where are your zeal and your might? The yearning of your heart and your compassion? They are withheld from me. For you are our father, though Abraham does not know us and Israel does not acknowledge us; you, O Lord, are our father; our Redeemer from of old is your name. Why, O Lord, do you make us stray from your ways and harden our heart, so that we do not fear you? Turn back for the sake of your servants, for the sake of the tribes that are your heritage. Your holy people took possession for a little while; but now our adversaries have trampled down your sanctuary. We have long been like those whom you do not rule, like those not called by your name.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence—as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil— to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed.

#### #14 - X

**READER:** The Reading is from the Prophecy of Jeremiah

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Jer 31:31-34) The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

#### #15 -

**READER:** The Reading is from Daniel

**DEACON:** Let us attend.

**READER:** (Dan 3:1-23) In his eighteenth year King Nebuchadnezzar made a golden statue whose height was sixty cubits and whose width was six cubits; he set it up on the plain of Dura in the province of Babylon. Then King Nebuchadnezzar sent for the satraps, the prefects, and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the justices, the magistrates, and all the officials of the provinces, to assemble and come to the dedication of the statue that King Nebuchadnezzar had set up. So the satraps, the prefects, and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the justices, the magistrates, and all the officials of the provinces, assembled for the dedication of the statue that King Nebuchadnezzar had set up. When they were standing before the statue that Nebuchadnezzar had set up, the herald proclaimed aloud, "You are commanded, O peoples,

nations, and languages, that when you hear the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, drum, and entire musical ensemble, you are to fall down and worship the golden statue that King Nebuchadnezzar has set up. Whoever does not fall down and worship shall immediately be thrown into a furnace of blazing fire." Therefore, as soon as all the peoples heard the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, drum, and entire musical ensemble, all the peoples, nations, and languages fell down and worshipped the golden statue that King Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

Accordingly, at this time certain Chaldeans came forward and denounced the Jews. They said to King Nebuchadnezzar, "O king, live forever! You, O king, have made a decree, that everyone who hears the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, drum, and entire musical ensemble, shall fall down and worship the golden statue, and whoever does not fall down and worship shall be thrown into a furnace of blazing fire. There are certain Jews whom you have appointed over the affairs of the province of Babylon: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. These pay no heed to you, O king. They do not serve your gods and they do not worship the golden statue that you have set up." Then Nebuchadnezzar in furious rage commanded that Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego be brought in; so they brought those men before the king. Nebuchadnezzar said to them, "Is it true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, that you do not serve my gods and you do not worship the golden statue that I have set up? Now if you are ready when you hear the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, drum, and entire musical ensemble to fall down and worship the statue that I have made, well and good. But if you do not worship, you shall immediately be thrown into a furnace of blazing fire, and who is the god that will deliver you out of my hands?" Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego answered the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we have no need to present a defense to you in this matter. If our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the furnace of blazing fire and out of your hand, O king, let him deliver us. But if not, be it known to you, O king, that we will not serve your gods and we will not worship the golden statue that you have set up."

Then Nebuchadnezzar was so filled with rage against Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego that his face was distorted. He ordered the furnace heated up seven times more than was customary, and ordered some of the strongest guards in his army to bind Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and to throw them into the furnace of blazing fire. So the men were bound, still wearing their tunics, their trousers, their hats, and their other garments, and they were thrown into the furnace of blazing fire. Because the king's command was very strict and the furnace was so overheated, the raging flames killed the men who lifted Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. But the three men, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, fell down, bound, into the furnace of blazing fire.

And they walked about in the midst of the flames, singing hymns to God and blessing the Lord. Then Abednego stood and offered this prayer. In the midst of the fire he opened his mouth and said: "Blessed are You, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and worthy of praise, and Your name is glorified forever. For You are just in all that You have done to us, and all Your works are true and Your ways right, and all Your judgments are truth.

"You have executed true judgments in all that You have brought upon us and upon Jerusalem, the Holy City of our fathers, for in truth and justice You have brought all this upon us because of our sins. For we have sinfully and lawlessly departed from You, and have sinned in all things and have not obeyed Your commandments. We have not observed nor done them, as You have commanded us that it might go well with us.

"So all that You have brought upon us, and all that You have done to us, You have done in true judgment. You have given us into the hands of lawless enemies, most hateful rebels, to an unjust king, the most wicked in all the world. And now we cannot open our mouths. Shame and disgrace have befallen Your servants and worshippers. For Your name's sake do not give us up utterly, and do not break Your covenant, and do not withdraw Your mercy from us, for the sake of Abraham Your beloved and for the sake of Isaac Your holy one, to whom You promised to make their descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as the sands of the sea.

"For we, O Lord, have become fewer than any nation, and are brought low this day in all the world because of our sins. And at this time there is no prince, or prophet, or leader, no burnt offering, or sacrifice, or oblation, or incense, no place to make an offering before You or to find mercy.

"Yet with contrite hearts and humble spirits may we be accepted, as though it were with burnt offerings of rams and bulls, and with tens of thousands of fat lambs. Such may our sacrifice be in Your sight this day, and may we wholly follow You, for there will be no shame for those who trust in You.

"And now with all our heart we follow You, we fear You and seek Your face. Do not put us to shame, but deal with us in Your forbearance and in Your abundant mercy. Deliver us in accordance with Your marvelous works, and give glory to Your name, O Lord! Let all who do harm to Your servants be put to shame. Let them be disgraced and deprived of all power and dominion, and let their strength be broken. "Let them know that You are the Lord, the only God, glorious over the whole world."





(Mat 28:1-20) Now after the Sabbath, as the first day of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it. His countenance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead men. But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you." So they went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word. And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, "Rejoice!" So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me." Now while they were going, behold, some of the guard came into the city and reported to the chief priests all the things that had happened. When they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers, saying, "Tell them, 'His disciples came at night and stole Him away while we slept.' And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will appease him and make you secure." So they took the money and did as they were instructed; and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day. Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." # Let All Mortal Flesh



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**PRIEST:** 

No one who is bound with the desires and pleasures of the flesh is worthy to approach or draw near or to serve You, O King of Glory; for to minister to You is great and awesome event to the heavenly powers. Nevertheless through Your unspeakable and boundless love for us, You became man, yet without change or alteration, and as Ruler of all became our High Priest, and committed to us the ministry of this liturgical and bloodless sacrifice. For You alone, O Lord our God, rules over those in heaven and on earth; who is borne on the throne of the Cherubim; who is Lord of the Seraphim and King of Israel; who alone is Holy and rests in the saints. Therefore, we entreat You who alone are good and ready to listen: Look down on us sinners, Your unprofitable servants, and cleanse our souls and our hearts from evil consciences; and by the power of the Holy Spirit enable we, who are endowed with the grace of the priesthood, to stand before this, Your holy table, and perform the sacred mystery of Your holy and pure Body and precious Blood. For we draw near to You, and bowing our necks we implore You: Do not turn Your face away from us, nor cast us out from among Your children; but make us, Your sinful and unworthy servants, worthy to offer gifts to You. For You are the Offerer and the Offered, the Receiver and the Received, O Christ our God, and to You we ascribe glory, together with Your Father, who is from everlasting, and Your all-holy, good, and life-creating Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.

**PRIEST:** 

Let all mortal flesh keep silent, and in fear and trembling stand, pondering nothing earthly minded. For the King of kings, and the Lord of lords comes to be slain, to give Himself as food to the faithful.

**DEACON:** Before Him go the ranks of angels, all the Principalities and Powers, the manyeyed Cherubim, and the six-winged Seraphim, covering their faces, singing their hymn: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

**PRIEST:** O God, cleanse me a sinner, and have mercy on me. (3X)

The clergy then bow to one another, asking forgiveness of one another, and then turn to the congregation and ask forgiveness from those present. Then, in front of the Table of Preparation, the priest censes the Offering:

**DEACON:** Lift up, Master.

The priest places the veil on the deacon's left shoulder and gives to him the paten, saying:

**PRIEST:** Lift up your hands to the holy place and bless the Lord.

The priest then takes the chalice, and preceded by servers bearing candles, a cross, and the censer, the celebrants make the Great Entrance. During this procession, we commemorate the hierarchy of the Holy Orthodox Church, the President, civil authorities, the city in which the Church is located, parish officers, those departed in blessed repose, and others who request such remembrance in the Liturgy.


## The Great Entrance

**PRIEST:** May the Lord God remember you and all Orthodox Christians in His

Heavenly Kingdom, always, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

At this point, it is customary for the congregation and the faithful to pray:







**PRIEST:** (Silently) The noble Joseph, when he had taken down Your most pure Body from the tree wrapped it in fine linen, anointed it with spices and placed it in a new tomb.

In the tomb with the body and in hell with the soul, in paradise with the thief and on the throne with the Father and the Spirit do You, Boundless Christ, fill all things.

Bearing life and more fruitful than paradise, brighter than any royal chamber: Your tomb, O Christ, is the fountain of our resurrection.

The priest takes the veils from the paten and the chalice and places them onto the altar, saying:

**PRIEST:** (Silently) The noble Joseph, when he had taken down Your most pure Body from the tree, wrapped it in fine linen and anointed it with spices, and placed it in a new tomb.

The priest takes the censer from the deacon and censes the Gifts, saying:

**PRIEST:** (Silently) Do good to Zion in Your good pleasure; rebuild the walls of Jerusalem. Then will You delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on Your altar. (Psalm 51:18-19)

The priest returns the censer to the deacon, then bows his head and asks the deacon:

**PRIEST:** Remember me, my brother and fellow minister.

**DEACON:** May the Lord God remember your priesthood in His Heavenly Kingdom.

**PRIEST:** Pray for me, my fellow minister.

**DEACON:** May the Holy Spirit descend on you, and the power of the Most High overshadow

you.

**PRIEST:** May the Holy Spirit Himself minister together with us all the days of our life.

**DEACON:** Remember me, holy Master.







### The Creed

The Creed, which follows, is a statement of the basic beliefs of the Church. It was adopted in its present form in 381AD, and contains twelve articles which constitute the 'mission statement' of the Orthodox faith.

#### **PEOPLE:**

- (1) I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and Earth, and of all things visible and invisible.
- (2) And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Only-begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages. (3) Light of Lights; True God of True God; begotten, not made; (4) of one essence with the Father, by whom all things were made;
- (5) Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. (6) And He was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered, and was buried. (7) And the third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of the Father; (8) and He shall come again with glory to judge the quick and the dead; Whose Kingdom shall have no end.
- (9) And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of Life, Who proceeds from the Father, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; Who spoke by the prophets.
- (10) And I believe in one Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. (11) I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. (12) I look for the Resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

**PRIEST:** 

O Existing One, Master, Lord God, Father almighty and adorable! It is truly meet and right and befitting the magnificence of Your holiness to praise You, to sing to You, to bless You, to worship You, to give thanks to You, to glorify You – the only truly existing God – and to offer to You this our reasonable worship with a contrite heart and a spirit of humility, for You have granted us the knowledge of Your truth. Who can utter Your mighty deeds? Or make all Your praises known? Or tell of all Your miracles at all times? O Master of all, Lord of heaven and earth and of all creation both visible and invisible; who sits on the throne of glory and beholds the depths; without beginning, invisible, incomprehensible, indescribable, changeless. O Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the great God and Savior, our hope, Who is the image of Your goodness, the seal of Your very likeness, showing forth in Himself You, O Father – the living Word, the true God, the eternal Wisdom, the Life, the Sanctification, the Power, the true Light, through Whom the Holy Spirit was revealed – the Spirit of Truth, the gift of sonship, the pledge of future inheritance, the first fruits of eternal blessings, the life-creating power, the fountain of sanctification, through Whom every creature of reason and understanding worships You and always sings to You a hymn of glory, for all things are Your servants. You are praised by angels, archangels, thrones, dominions, principalities, authorities, powers, and many-eyed Cherubim. Round about You stand the Seraphim, one with six wings and the other with six wings; with two they cover their faces, with two they cover their feet, and with two they fly, crying to one another with unceasing voices and ever-resounding praises:

Singing the triumphant hymn, shouting, proclaiming, and saying:

As the Priest exclaims the above, the Deacon takes the "star", the cross shaped cover placed over the host, and making the sign of the Cross by touching each point of the star to the paten removes it, kisses it, and places it aside.



**PRIEST:** 

With these blessed powers, O Master who loves us, we sinners also cry aloud and say: Holy are You – truly most Holy – and there is no bound to the magnificence of Your holiness. You are gracious in all Your deeds, for with righteousness and true judgment You have ordered all things for us. When You created mankind by taking dust from the earth, and honored him with Your own Image, O God, You set him in a paradise of delight, promising him eternal life and the enjoyment of everlasting blessings in the observance of Your commandments. But when he disobeyed You, the true God Who had created him, and was deceived by the guile of the serpent, becoming subject to death through his own transgressions, You, O God, in Your righteous judgment, sent him forth from Paradise into this world, returning him to the earth from which he was taken, yet providing for him the salvation of regeneration in Your Christ Himself. For You did not turn Yourself away forever from Your creature, whom You had made, O Good One, nor did You forget the work of Your hands. Through the tender compassion of Your mercy, You visited him in various ways; You sent prophets; You performed

mighty works by Your saints, who in every generation were well-pleasing to You; You spoke to us by the mouths of Your servants the prophets, foretelling to us the salvation which was to come; You gave us the Law as a help; You appointed angels as guardians. And when the fullness of time had come, You spoke to us through Your Son Himself, by Whom You also made the ages; Who, being the Radiance of Your Glory and the Image of Your Person, upholding all things by the word of His power, thought it not robbery to be equal to You, the God and Father. He was God before the ages, yet He appeared on earth and lived among us, becoming incarnate of the Holy Virgin; He emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant, being likened to the body of our lowliness, that He might liken us to the image of His glory. For as by man sin entered the world, and by sin death, so it pleased Your Only-Begotten Son, Who was in Your bosom, the God and Father, Who was born of a woman, the holy Theotokos and ever-Virgin Mary, Who was born under the Law, to condemn sin in His flesh, so that those who were dead in Adam might be made alive in Your Christ Himself. He lived in this world and gave us commandments of salvation; releasing us from the delusions of idolatry, He brought us to the knowledge of You, the true God and Father. He obtained us for His own chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation. Having cleansed us in water, and sanctified us with the Holy Spirit, He gave Himself as a ransom for death, in which we were held captive, sold under sin. Descending through the Cross into hell – that He might fill all things with Himself – He loosed the pangs of death. He arose on the third day, having made for all flesh a path to the resurrection from the dead, since it was not possible for the Author of Life to be a victim of corruption. So He became the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep, the first-born of the dead, that He might be Himself truly the first in all things. Ascending into heaven, He sat down at the right hand of Your majesty on high, and He will come to render to every man according to his works. And as memorials of His saving Passion, He has left us these things which we have set forth according to His command. For when He was about to go forth to His voluntary and ever-memorable and life-creating death – in the night in which He gave Himself up for the life of the world – He took bread into His holy and pure hands; and having shown it to You, the God and Father, having given thanks, blessed and hallowed it, and broken it,

He gave it to His holy Disciples and Apostles saying: Take! Eat! This is My Body which is broken for you for the remission of sins.

**PRIEST:** Likewise He took the cup of the fruit of the vine, and having mingled it and given thanks, blessed and hallowed it,







Remember, O Lord, those who are in the deserts, mountains, caverns and pits of the earth. Remember, O Lord, those

who live in chastity and godliness, in austerity and holiness of life. Remember, O Lord, this country and all civil authorities; grant them a secure and lasting peace; speak good things into their hearts concerning Your Church and all Your people, that we, in their tranquility, may lead calm and peaceful lives in all godliness and sanctity. Remember, O Lord, every principality and authority; our brothers and sisters who serve in the government and the armed forces. Preserve the good in goodness, and make the evil to be good by Your goodness. Remember, O Lord, the people here present and also those who are absent for honorable reasons. Have mercy on them and on us according to the multitude of Your mercies. Fill their treasuries with every good thing; preserve their marriages in peace and harmony; raise the infants; guide the young; support the aged; encourage the faint-hearted; reunite the separated; lead back those who are in error and join them to Your Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church; free those who are held captive by unclean spirits; sail with those who sail; travel with those who travel by land and by air; defend the widows; protect the orphans; free the captives; heal the sick. Remember, O God, those who are in courts, in mines, in exile, in harsh labor, and those in any kind of affliction, necessity, or distress. Remember, O Lord our God, all those who entreat Your great loving-kindness; those who love us and those who hate us; those who have asked us to pray for them, unworthy though we be; and remember all Your people, O Lord our God. Pour out Your rich mercy upon all of them, granting them all the petitions which are for their salvation. And remember, O God, all those whom we have not remembered through ignorance, forgetfulness or the multitude of names; since You know the name and age of each, even from a mother's womb. For You, O Lord, are the Helper of the helpless, the Hope of the hopeless, the Savior of the bestormed, the Haven of the voyager, the Physician of the sick. Be all things to all people, for You know each of us and our requests, our homes, and our needs. Deliver this city, O Lord, and every city and country, from famine, plague, earthquake, flood, fire, sword, invasion by enemies, and civil war.





**DEACON:** Divide, Master, the Holy Bread.

The priest reverently divides the Holy Bread into four parts.

**PRIEST:** Divided and distributed is the Lamb of God: who is divided, yet not disunited; who is ever eaten, yet never consumed; but sanctifies those who partake thereof.

The priest arranges the pieces onto the paten in the form of a cross. The portion containing the symbol **IC** is placed into the chalice. The portion containing the symbol **XC** is used to commune the celebrants. The other two portions, containing symbols **NI** and **KA**, are broken for communion of the faithful.

**DEACON:** Fill, Master, the Holy Cup.

As the priest places the portion IC into the chalice, he makes the sign of the Cross with it over the chalice and says:

**PRIEST:** The fullness of the Holy Spirit.

**DEACON:** Amen. Bless, Master, the warm water.

PRIEST:	Blessed is the warmth of Your Holy Things always, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.
	The deacon pours sufficient water into the chalice in the sign of the Cross, saying:
DEACON:	The warmth of faith, full of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
PRIEST AND	
PEOPLE:	I believe, O Lord, and confess that You are truly the Christ, the Son of the Living God, who came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the first. Also I believe that this is truly Your own most pure Body, and that this is truly Your own Precious Blood. Therefore I pray to You: have mercy upon me and pardon my transgressions, both voluntary and involuntary, of word and of deed, committed in knowledge or in ignorance. And make me worthy, without condemnation, to partake of Your most pure Mysteries, for the remission of my sins, and unto life everlasting. Amen.
	Of Your Mystical Supper, O Son of God, accept me today as a communicant; for I will not speak of Your Mystery to Your enemies, neither like Judas will I give You a kiss; but like the thief I will confess You: Remember me, O Lord, in Your Kingdom.  May the communion of Your Holy Mysteries be neither to my judgment, nor to
	my condemnation, O Lord, but to the healing of soul and body. Amen.
The priest breaks	the portion containing the symbol <b>XC</b> into a number of pieces equal to the number of clergy to be communed.
PRIEST:	The precious and most holy Body of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ is given unto me, the unworthy priest for the remission of my sins, and unto life everlasting.

	After partaking, the priest then says:
PRIEST:	Deacon, draw near.
	The deacon approaches, bows, asks forgiveness, then kisses the altar saying:
DF4CON.	Give me Master the precious and holy Rody of our Lord and God and Savior

The priest gives the deacon a portion of the Holy Bread, saying:

PRIEST: To the deacon \_\_\_\_\_ is given the precious, holy, and most pure Body of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ, for the remission of his sins, and unto life everlasting.

The deacon kisses the priest's hand as he takes the Holy Body, and goes behind the altar and prays with bowed head:

Jesus Christ.

The priest takes a portion of the Holy Body for himself, and prays:

**DEACON:** I believe, O Lord, and I confess .....

**PRIEST:** The precious and holy Blood of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ is

given unto me, the unworthy priest \_\_\_\_\_ for the remission of my sins, and unto

life everlasting. Amen.

The priest then drinks from the chalice three times, saying:

**PRIEST:** In the name of the Father

**DEACON:** Amen.

**PRIEST:** and of the Son

**DEACON:** Amen.

**PRIEST:** and of the Holy Spirit. **DEACON:** Amen. Amen. Amen.

The priest cleans the chalice and his lips with the cloth and says:

**PRIEST:** Lo, this has touched my lips, it shall wash away my iniquities, and cleanse me

from my sins.

Deacon, draw near.

DEACON: Lo, I draw near unto the immortal King and our God. Give to me, Master, the

precious and holy Blood of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ.

The priest holds the chalice, saying:

**PRIEST:** The servant of God, the deacon \_\_\_\_\_\_, partakes of the precious and holy Blood

of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ, for the remission of his sins, and

unto life everlasting.

The deacon then repeats the practice followed by the priest, after which the priest says:

**PRIEST:** Lo, this has touched your lips, it shall take away your iniquities, and cleanse you

of your sins.

The priest then divides the portions **NI** and **KA** of the Holy Lamb and puts them into the chalice for the communion of the people. One such portion may be divided for use on the paten for distribution in communing the faithful. The chalice is then covered with a veil, the Royal Doors are opened, and the deacon takes the chalice through the doors saying:

**DEACON:** In the fear of God, and with faith and love, draw near!






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The faithful are now communed, with the priest saying to each person:

# **PRIEST:** The precious and all-holy Body and Blood of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ is given to the servant (handmaid) of God \_\_\_\_\_, for the remission of sins and unto life everlasting. Amen.

The faithful then repetitively sing the following hymn while all are awaiting communion:





After all have been communed, the celebrants return to the altar and replace the chalice. The deacon holds the paten over the chalice as he says the Hymn of the Resurrection:

**DEACON:** Having beheld the Resurrection of Christ, let us worship the Holy Lord Jesus, the only Sinless One. We venerate Your Cross, O Christ, and Your Holy Resurrection we praise and glorify, for You are our God, and we know no other than You; we call on Your name. Come all you faithful, let us venerate Christ's Holy Resurrection! For, behold, through the Cross joy has come into all the world. Let us ever bless the Lord, singing His Holy Resurrection, for by enduring the Cross for us, He has destroyed death by death. (Paschal Resurrection Ode)

Shine! Shine! O New Jerusalem! The glory of the Lord has shone on you! Exult now and be glad, O Zion! Be radiant, O Pure Theotokos, in the Resurrection of your Son! (Paschal Kanon, Ode 9)



**PRIEST:** O God, save Your people, and bless Your inheritance.








