Forgive them and us, for You are a good God who loves humanity. Fill their mouths with Your praise, open their lips to glorify Your name, stretch forth their hands to perform Your statutes. encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them all. See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit, do not despise prophesying, but test everything; hold fast what is good, abstain from every form of evil. You accepted the great Apostle Paul who blasphemed against You. You accepted the Apostle Peter after he denied You three times, promising him, "You are Peter and upon this rock will I build My Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it, and I shall give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven." For all these we are now confident of Your promises, and we pray to You and ask You at this hour to hear and accept our supplication as a sweet incense offered to You. Visit these, Your servants and handmaids. Pardon and forgive them, O God. Overlook the sins they have committed in word, deed, or thought, whether in knowledge or in ignorance, for there is no one who lives and does not sin, for You only are without sin, and Your righteousness is to all eternity, and Your word is truth. In your love for humanity receive now these Your servants who repent of their sins, and regard not their transgressions. For You are our God, Who has commanded that those who fall into sin be forgiven, even unto seventy times seven. For as great as Your majesty is also Your mercy, and to You are due all glory, honor, and worship, to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

CHOIR: Amen.


