Vespers Old Testament Readings – August 29th, Feast of the Beheading of St. John the Forerunner

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The first reading is from the Prophecy of Isaiah.

DEACON: Let us attend!

READER: {Isaiah 40:1-3, 9; 41:17-18; 45:8; 48:20-21; 54:1}

1 "Comfort, yes, comfort My people!" Says your God. 2 "Speak comfort to Jerusalem, and cry out to her, that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned; for she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins." 3 The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; Make straight in the desert a highway for our God. 9 O Zion, you that bring good tidings, get up into the high mountain; O Jerusalem, you that bring good tidings, lift up your voice with strength, lift it up, be not afraid; say to the cities of Judah, "Behold your God!" 17 "The poor and needy seek water, but there is none, their tongues fail for thirst. I, the Lord, will hear them; I, the God of Israel, will not forsake them. 18 I will open rivers in desolate heights, and fountains in the midst of the valleys; I will make the wilderness a pool of water, and the dry land springs of water. 8 "Rain down, you heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness; let the earth open, let them bring forth salvation, and let righteousness spring up together. I, the Lord, have created it. 20 Go forth from Babylon! Flee from the Chaldeans! With a voice of singing, declare, proclaim this, utter it to the end of the earth; say, "The Lord has redeemed His servant Jacob!" 21 And they did not thirst when He led them through the deserts; He caused the waters to flow from the rock for them; He also split the rock, and the waters gushed out. I "Sing, O barren, you that have not borne! Break forth into singing, and cry aloud, you that have not labored with child! For more are the children of the desolate than the children of the married woman," says the Lord.

READER: The second reading is from the Prophecy of Malachi.

DEACON: Let us attend!

READER: {Malachi 3:1-3, 5-7, 12, 18; 4:4-6}

1 "Behold, I send My messenger, and he will prepare the way before Me. And the Lord, whom you seek, will suddenly come to His temple, even the messenger of the covenant, in whom you delight. Behold, He is coming," Says the Lord of hosts. 2 "But who can endure the day of His coming? And who can stand when He appears? For He is like a refiner's fire and like launderer's soap. 3 He will sit as a refiner and a purifier of silver; He will purify the sons of Levi, and purge them as gold and silver, that they may offer to the Lord an offering in righteousness. 5 And I

will come near you for judgment; I will be a swift witness against sorcerers, against adulterers, against perjurers, against those who exploit wage earners and widows and orphans, and against those who turn away an alien-- because they do not fear Me," Says the Lord of hosts. 6 "For I am the Lord, I do not change; therefore you are not consumed, O sons of Jacob. 7 Yet from the days of your fathers you have gone away from My ordinances and have not kept them. Return to Me, and I will return to you," Says the Lord of hosts. "But you said, 'In what way shall we return?' 12 "And all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land," Says the Lord of hosts. 18 Then you shall again discern between the righteous and the wicked, between one who serves God and one who does not serve Him. 4 "Remember the Law of Moses, My servant, which I commanded him in Horeb for all Israel, with the statutes and judgments. 5 Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord. 6 And he will turn the hearts of the fathers to the children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the earth with a curse."

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: The third reading is from the Book of Wisdom.

DEACON: Let us attend!

READER: {Wisdom 4:7, 16-17, 19-20; 5:1-7}

7 But the just man, though he die early, shall be at rest. 16 Yes, the just man dead condemns the sinful who live, and youth swiftly completed condemns the many years of the wicked man grown old. 17 For they see the death of the wise man and do not understand what the LORD intended for him, or why he made him secure. 19 And they shall afterward become dishonored corpses and an unceasing mockery among the dead. For he shall strike them down speechless and prostrate and rock them to their foundations; they shall be utterly laid waste and shall be in grief and their memory shall perish. 20 Fearful shall they come, at the counting up of their sins, and their lawless deeds shall convict them to their face. 1 Then shall the just one with great assurance confront his oppressors who set at naught his labors. 2 Seeing this, they shall be shaken with dreadful fear, and amazed at the unlooked-for salvation. 3 They shall say among themselves, rueful and groaning through anguish of spirit: "This is he whom once we held as a laughingstock and as a type for mockery, 4 fools that we were! His life we accounted madness, and his death dishonored. 5 See how he is accounted among the sons of God; how his lot is with the saints! 6 We, then, have strayed from the way of truth, and the light of justice did not shine for us, and the sun did not rise for us. 7 We had our fill of the ways of mischief and of ruin; we journeyed through impassable deserts, but the way of the LORD we knew not."

TONE 1 (by Patriarch Germanos)

What shall we call you, O Prophet?

Angel, Apostle, Martyr?

Angel, for you have spent your life like those who have no body.

Apostle, for you have taught the nations,

and Martyr, for your head has been cut off for the sake of Christ.//

Pray to Him then that our souls may be granted great mercy!

Let us celebrate the memorial of the beheading of the Forerunner;

at that time you gushed forth blood upon the <u>plat</u>ter,//

and now you pour forth healing to the ends of the earth!

Today the mother of murder,

acting with more wickedness than has ever been seen,

has roused her utterly wanton daughter to evil

against the divinely-chosen and greatest of all the Prophets.

For while hateful <u>Her</u>od was celebrating his ungodly <u>birth</u>day,

she contrived according to the oath he had given her for her dancing,

to beg for the precious head of the herald of God

that gushed forth miracles.

And he, quite mad, fulfilled his promise

and gave it to her as reward for her brazen dancing.

But the initiate of the coming of Christ

ceased not after death to rebuke them for their repulsive union,

but reproved them loudly, saying:

"It does not become you to commit adultery with the wife of your brother *Philip*."

Oh, birthday, killer of prophets!

Oh, banquet full of blood!

Let us, arrayed in white, piously celebrate the Beheading of the Forerunner,

and rejoice on this day as on a great feast!

And let us ask the Forerunner to be seech the Trinity for us,//

that we be delivered from dishonorable passions, and that our souls be saved!

TONE 4

Herod's birthday celebration was a lawless and shameful feast,

for, spellbound by feminine licentiousness and stricken with madness by a woman's <u>wan</u>tonness, he cut off the head of the Forerunner;

but he did not cut out the Prophet's tongue, which had denounced his foolishness.

Spilling innocent blood, he wished to conceal a lawless sin;

but he could not stop the voice of one who called all to repentance.

He joined in taking delight in <u>mur</u>der, but let us join in celebrating with love the blessed slaying of <u>John</u> the <u>Bap</u>tist; for he was in Hades in anticipation to proclaim to those who sat in darkness and in the <u>shad</u>ow of death the Life, the <u>Day</u>spring <u>from</u> on high,// Christ our God, Who alone is rich in <u>mer</u>cy.

Come, O people,

let us praise the Prophet and Martyr and Baptist of the <u>Sav</u>ior!
For being an <u>Angel</u> in the flesh, he thoroughly reproved <u>Her</u>od
by condemning his act of unlawful a<u>dul</u>tery;
and through the impious dance, he endured the cutting <u>off</u> of his <u>pre</u>cious head,
that he might proclaim to those in <u>Ha</u>des
the good news of the Resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead;//
and he earnestly intercedes with the Lord, that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Come, O faithful,

Let us praise the Prophet, and Martyr, and Baptist of the <u>Sav</u>ior! Living in <u>ex</u>ile, he dwelt in the <u>wil</u>derness, eating wild honey and <u>lo</u>custs; and he reproved the <u>king</u> who trans<u>gressed</u> the Law. But he comforted our faintheartedness, <u>say</u>ing:// "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!"

VERSE: GLORY TO THE FATHER, AND TO THE SON, AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT;

TONE 5 (by John the Monk)

<u>Her</u>od, intending to escape reproaches for his sinful <u>do</u>ings, gave your head, O Forerunner, to a lawless <u>wo</u>man.

For the <u>wretch</u>ed man did not understand that by offering it on a platter he was con<u>demn</u>ing himself.

But as <u>teach</u>er of purity and guide to redeeming repentance, O <u>Bap</u>tist,//intercede with Christ to deliver us from the dis<u>grace</u> of <u>pas</u>sions!

now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

Sing, O people!

Sing the praises of the <u>Mother of our God;</u> for to<u>day</u> she delivers her soul, <u>full</u> of light, into the im<u>ma</u>culate hands of Him Who was made incarnate of her with<u>out</u> seed. APOSTICHA - TONE 2

O Baptist John, preacher of repentance, when your head was cut off, you sanctified the earth; for you made clear God's Law to the faithful and destroyed lawlessness. As you stand before the throne of the heavenly King,// entreat Him to have mercy on our souls!

O most holy John,

you were beheaded for the sake of the Law of the Lord.

Filled with the boldness of speech, you rebuked the evil king for his transgression of the Law.

The host of Angels marvel at your strength;

the choir of Apostles and Martyrs praise you.

We also celebrate your yearly commemoration,//

glorifying the Holy Trinity Who crowned you, O most blessed <u>Fore</u>runner.

The Prophet from among the <u>Proph</u>ets, and greater than all the <u>Proph</u>ets, <u>sanc</u>tified from his mother's womb to the Lord's <u>ser</u>vice, today has been beheaded by a <u>law</u>less king; and openly rebuking the woman who danced im<u>mod</u>estly, both be<u>fore</u> and after his be<u>head</u>ing, he put shame upon that sinful <u>gath</u>ering.

Thus, we cry out: "O <u>Bap</u>tist John,// as you have boldness to speak, intercede on be<u>half</u> of our souls!"

VERSE: GLORY TO THE FATHER, AND TO THE SON, AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT;

TONE 8

O Forerunner of the Savior,

you rebuked kings so that they would not work in<u>iq</u>uity; but the frolicking of a lawless woman persuaded <u>Her</u>od to cut <u>off</u> your head. Therefore we bless your name from the rising to the <u>set</u>ting of the sun. Since you stand with boldness be<u>fore</u> the Lord,// earnestly entreat Him to <u>save</u> our souls!

VERSE: NOW AND EVER, AND UNTO AGES OF AGES. AMEN.

TONE 8 (Theotokion)

Unwedded Virgin, you ineffably conceived <u>God</u> in the flesh!
O <u>Mother of God</u> most high, accept the cries of your servants, O <u>blame</u>less one! Grant cleansing of trans<u>gres</u>sions to all!// Receive our prayers and pray to <u>save</u> our souls!

TONE 2 Troparion

The memory of the righteous is celebrated with hymns of praise, but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for you, O Forerunner.

You were shown in truth to be the most honorable of the Prophets, for you were deemed worthy to baptize in the steams of the Jordan Him Whom they foretold.

Therefore, having suffered for the truth with joy, you proclaimed to those in hell God Who appeared in the flesh,//Who takes away the sin of the world and grants us great mercy.

VERSE: GLORY TO THE FATHER, AND TO THE SON, AND TO THE HOLY SPIRIT, NOW AND EVER, AND UNTO AGES OF AGES. AMEN.

TONE 5 Kontakion

The <u>glo</u>rious beheading of the <u>Fore</u>runner became an act of divine dispen<u>sation</u>, for he <u>preached</u> to those in hell the coming of the <u>Sav</u>ior. Let He<u>ro</u>dias lament, for she entreated lawless <u>mur</u>der, loving not the Law of God, nor e<u>ternal life</u>,// but that which is <u>false</u> and <u>tem</u>poral.

Gospel Reading – August 29th, Feast of the Beheading of St. John the Forerunner

{Mark 6:14-30} 14 At that time... King Herod heard of Him, for His name had become well known. And he said, "John the Baptist is risen from the dead, and therefore these powers are at work in him." 15 Others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is the Prophet, or like one of the prophets." 16 But when Herod heard, he said, "This is John, whom I beheaded; he has been raised from the dead!" 17 For Herod himself had sent and laid hold of John, and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife; for he had married her. 18 For John had said to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." 19 Therefore Herodias held it against him and wanted to kill him, but she could not; 20 for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a just and holy man, and he protected him. And when he heard him, he did many things, and heard him gladly. 21 Then an opportune day came when Herod on his birthday gave a feast for his nobles, the high officers, and the chief men of Galilee. 22 And when Herodias' daughter herself came in and danced, and pleased Herod and those who sat with him, the king said to the girl, "Ask me whatever you want, and I will give it to you." 23 He also swore to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom." 24 So she went out and said to her mother, "What shall I ask?" And she said, "The head of John the Baptist!" 25 Immediately she came in with haste to the king and asked, saying, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." **26** And the king was exceedingly sorry; yet, because of the oaths and because of those who sat with him, he did not want to refuse her. 27 Immediately the king sent an executioner and commanded his head to be brought. And he went and beheaded him in prison, 28 brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl; and the girl gave it to her mother. 29 When his disciples heard of it, they came and took away his corpse and laid it in a tomb. 30 Then the apostles gathered to Jesus and told Him all things, both what they had done and what they had taught.
